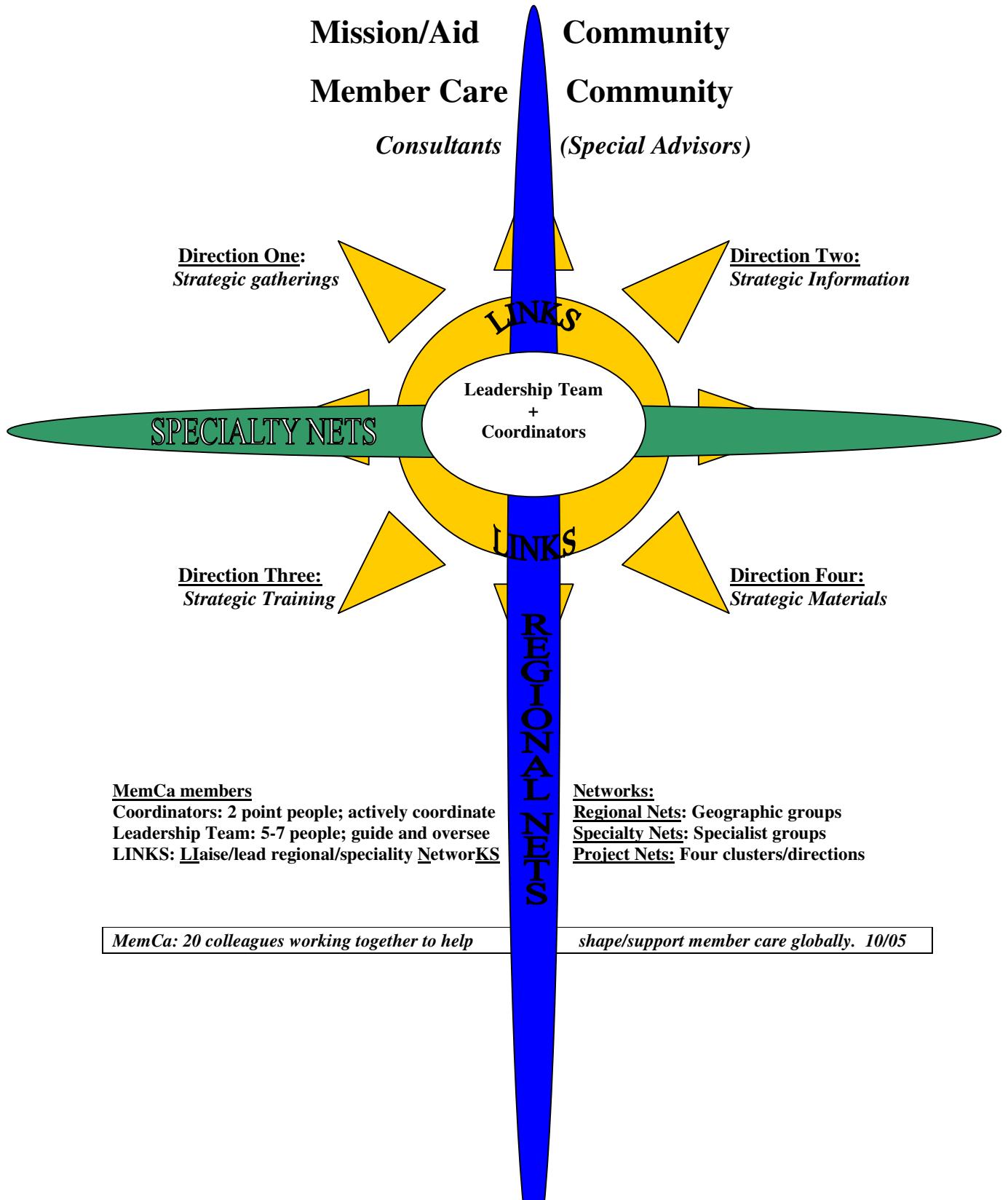


Global Member Care Resources (MemCa)—Functional Structure

MemCa Commitments—for Regional and Speciality Representatives

1. Communicating together:

We stay in regular email contact, respond as necessary to monthly updates from LT;
send others in MemCa core updates from your network ministry (at least once-twice a year)

2. Meeting together:

We attend our global MemCa gatherings, usually held in conjunction with the Mission Commission Conferences (about every two years; next one is 18-24 June 2006, Cape Town, RSA).

3. Doing projects together:

We do projects related to our “Four Directions”; each member is part of at least one the project that blends together a) our MemCa goals, b) your work priorities and interests, c) your skill sets.

4. Connecting globally together:

We contribute to our Web site (once-twice a year, based on your network area, with links to your web site); contribute to our *Global Briefing* when possible (sent electronically to 1700+ 3X/year).

5. Thinking “MemCa” together:

We embrace our distinctives and our “MemCa mentality” (a way of thinking/linking):

- *identifying/“filing” member care gaps (helping to shape/support member care)
- *intentionally developing and not just providing member care (proveloping member care)
- *thinking of both our own ministry/geographic location and thinking internationally (pro-omni)
- *working together and building relationships (proactive connections)
- *establishing good communication links/updates globally and regionally (knitting the net)
- *seeing member care as a diverse, multi-disciplinary, multi-cultural, multi-generational field
- *connecting with sectors/resources that are outside of mainstream Evangelical missions
- *focusing on the folks from A4 regions (Asia, Africa, Arabic-Turkic, America-Latina) and UPGs.
