

MemCa Projects: Four Directions

Direction One: Strategic Gatherings

- **Field Faces:** Member care workers visiting/consulting on A4 fields
- **Global Faces:** Connecting member care leaders/colleagues at consultations around the world

Direction Two: Strategic Information

- **Web Consortium:** A core group of member care organisations working together as a "web of web sites"
- **Communication Updates:** The MemCa *Global Briefing*, sent to 1500+ people electronically, three times a year

Direction Three: Strategic Materials

- **Translation:** Key materials in Chinese, Arabic and other languages, and distribution
- **Books and Articles:** Materials to advance member care practice; articles and an international case study book, etc.

Direction Four: Strategic Training

- **Workshops and courses:** Coordinating/offering teaching on crucial topics like crisis care, relational skills, etc.
- **On-line Member Care Course:** Ten topic areas and a "virtual faculty" to interact with participants.
